

## Macintosh Dial-up Settings for OS X

1. Click on the Apple Menu in the upper left hand corner of your screen and select System Preferences.
2. From the System Preferences window click the Network icon.
3. On the Show pop-up window, make sure that Internal Modem is selected.
4. Click on the TCP/IP tab and enter the following settings.
  - Configure: Select Using PPP
  - IP Address: Should say Provided by PPP server
  - Subnet Mask and Router should be left blank.
  - Domain Name Servers: This field can be left blank.
  - Search Domains: This field can be left blank.
5. Click on the PPP tab and enter the following settings.
  - Service Provider: OnlineNW ( or OnlineMac/Macnet/Viclink/Spessart depending on your account.)
  - Telephone Number: 503-472-5920 - Alternate Number: 503-472-7828
  - Account Name: Enter your username. This is the first part of your Email Address before the @ symbol (ex: johndoe@OnlineNW.com.)
  - Password: Enter your password
  - The Save Password checkbox should be checked.
6. Click on the Modem tab.
  - Check Show modem status in menu bar. (optional)
7. Click the Apply Now button at the bottom of the screen.

The PPP Options Button at the bottom of the PPP tab offers settings such as:

- Connect automatically when starting TCP/IP application. (Internet Explorer, Apple Mail, etc.)
- Disconnect when user logs out
- Disconnect times, etc.

### To connect to the Internet

Once the configurations above have been completed connecting to the Internet can be done through the following steps:

1. Double click on the Macintosh Hard Disk icon on the desktop.
2. Double click Applications and then double click Internet Connect (drag this icon to the Dock for easy access).
3. Be sure the phone number and user name are listed properly and click the Connect button.

Or, launch your browser or email application and your computer should automatically dial up and connect.
